Dear WHRI community,

We have now completed approximately three weeks of physical distancing and I hope that for some of you, you are settling into a new normal. It is clear that we are preparing for a marathon and not a quick sprint with this epidemic. This means taking steps to make longer term plans for distancing and isolation, and the associated impacts on our research community. I want to acknowledge that this has been extremely challenging for many of us, and I am proud of the extensive measures I have seen British Columbians take to adhere to the Provincial Health Officer guidelines. Our consistent actions to follow social distancing guidelines and wash our hands is evident and it is imperative that we stay the course.

As you know, the research curtailment process was rolled out on C&W campus on March 27, 2020 and in alignment with the processes rolled out at UBC, was originally in effect until April 15, 2020. In accordance with guidance from the Provincial Health Officer, UBC has extended this **curtailment of research activities until April 30, 2020**, and the WHRI will follow the same extension deadline. Those who have received a research exemption already will automatically have their exemptions extended to April 30. Principal Investigators who wish to still apply for a research exemption, particularly if they are beginning COVID-related research, can do so by following this link: https://rc.bcchr.ca/redcap/surveys/?s=8MWWRETF78.

We ask that all Principal Investigators discuss this curtailment extension with their research personnel, administrative staff and trainees and adjust any plans already in place accordingly. On April 2, 2020, our academic community received the devastating news that the CIHR <u>Spring 2020</u> <u>Project Grant competition was cancelled</u>. Nominated Principal Applicants (NPA) from the Spring 2020 Project Grant competition will be given the option to bring their submission forward automatically to the Fall 2020 Project Grant competition, including the ability to provide a one-page supplement for additional support data or publications. NPAs will also have the option to withdraw their application and resubmit a new or updated application to the Fall competition.

We send our sincere sympathies to all of our investigators who invested considerable time in this competition, and we thank the Research & Technology Development Office at BCCHR for their tireless support with so many of these applications.

On a positive note, the Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research, at the request of the BC Ministry of Health, has announced some new strategic research activities, including a **COVID-19 Research**

Response Fund. The MSFHR COVID-19 Research Response Fund will support research questions arising out of the COVID-19 pandemic. More details about this fund will be provided on April 6, 2020. See attached email for more details with regards to the priority areas.

If your research was not approved as exempt, no one from the research team is permitted to be onsite to take part in any aspect of the research.
