Dear WHRI community,

I believe strongly that research institutes play an important role in sharing science, in an accessible way, with the public. For the past few years, we at the WHRI have held public events designed to share key findings in women's health research with a general public audience. While these events were typically held face to face in the past, our experience with COVID-19 and the move towards online methods of communication has meant that our public events have also shifted online. While we miss the experience that comes about from face to face social interaction, we have also seen an increase in the number of attendees to our public events, which signals to me that moving public events to an online forum is one way to dismantle the barriers that exist between the public and access to health information.

This week our public event focused on privacy and security in health research, a topic that is very relevant to research participants who might be keen to participate in research, but may also be skeptical about the security involved and how their identity will be preserved. Dr. Holly Longtaff, Research Privacy Director at the Provincial Health Services Authority, led a fascinating and engaging talk about why partricipation in research is necessary, and how the public can do so safely. Jessica Sutherland, member of the Patient Research Advisory Board for the Endometriosis and Pelvic Pain Laboratory at UBC, and research participant, moderated and facilitated a terrific discussion on this.

## **REMINDER - REGISTER ONLINE FOR YOUR SECOND DOSE**

All CW research staff need to register online at getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca for their second dose of COVID-

19 vaccine. Based on your Personal Health Number, the system knows when you received your first dose and will calculate when you are due for your second dose.

You will get an invitation by text, email or phone call to book your second dose appointment approximately eight weeks after your first dose.

If you are due for your second dose and have **not yet been contacted** with instructions on how to book your second dose appointment, please call the provincial immunization centre (<u>1-833-838-2323</u>) and let them know you are a health-care worker who is due for your second dose.

For international personnel: If you do not have a personal health number, you need to register for your vaccine by calling the province-wide call centre (1-833-838-2323) or in-person at a ServiceBC office and advising the agent that you are a health-care worker. Online bookings on the provincial platform require a personal health number.

## **PHSA Updates**

### PHSA MASK USE POLICY & SELF-SERVE DISPENSERS

- Self-serve medical face mask dispensers are installed at building entrances in order to comply
  with the provincial mask policy, which states that masks worn in medical facilities including
  hospitals must be medical grade.
- The self-serve mask dispensers are intended for all care providers, staff, vendors and contractors, who should replace their personal mask with a medical mask at a building entrance, or proceed to a different entrance if there are no medical masks available.
- All patients will be offered a medical face mask by entrance screeners; however as previously stated, there may be reasons why someone is unable or declines to wear a mask, including history of abuse and trauma, mental health concerns, physical health conditions, or age.
- All persons entering hospital buildings are requested to don a medical mask by following these procedures:
  - 1. Remove your personal mask if you're wearing one;
  - 2. Sanitize your hands using hand sanitizer; and
  - 3. Remove one medical mask from the dispenser and follow proper procedures to don the mask.
- Please remember that masks are only one part of our infection control strategy. Stay home if you
  have any signs of illness, complete PHSA's self-screening assessment tool before arriving onsite,

practice physical distancing and maintain good hand hygiene.
