Weekly WHRI Community Update – June 18, 2021

Dear WHRI community,

On the advice of the Provincial Health Officer, UBC, as well as other BC-based academic institutions, are currently planning for a return to in-person activities (including in-person instruction) in September 2021. This is wonderful news to learn! For our members who are UBC faculty and students, UBC has just approved a new approach to remote/hybrid work arrangements, and details of this plan will be shared by Department Heads as early as next week. For our members who are situated on the C&W campus, these guidance documents will be considered alongside our campus' research resumption plans, informed by both the Provincial Health Officer as well as WorkSafeBC, with details on the latter forthcoming. In parallel to UBC, PHSA is also updating their remote work policy, which will be relevant to PHSA staff on the C&W campus.

In the interim, I would encourage you to initiate discussions regarding return to on-site activities with your own teams (students, staff, administrators, other research personnel) to determine who may be required to, and who would like to be onsite to prepare for a September resumption.

A number of guidance documents have been developed, including: the <u>COVID-19 Return-To-Campus</u> <u>Primer</u> and the <u>COVID-19 Go-Forward Guidelines for B.C.'s Post-Secondary Sector (June 2021 edition)</u>, and the not yet released <u>Return-to-Campus Guidelines</u>. Additional campus specific guidelines will be released in the coming weeks.

We are committed to continuing our communication to you regarding this evolving subject of return to on-site and on-campus activities.

With the warmer weather, the steady climb in the number of vaccinated citizens, and now this planning for a near-normal September, there is much to be hopeful for.

### **REMINDER - REGISTER ONLINE FOR YOUR SECOND DOSE**

All CW research staff need to register online at <a href="mailto:getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca">getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca</a> for their second dose of COVID-19 vaccine. Based on your Personal Health Number, the system knows when you received your first dose and will calculate when you are due for your second dose.

You will get an invitation by text, email or phone call to book your second dose appointment approximately eight weeks after your first dose.

If you are due for your second dose within the next two weeks and you have not yet been contacted with instructions on how to book your second dose appointment, please call the provincial immunization centre (<u>1-833-838-2323</u>) and let them know you are a health-care worker who is due for your second dose.

For international personnel: If you do not have a personal health number, you need to register for your vaccine by calling the province-wide call centre (1-833-838-2323) or in-person at a ServiceBC office and advising the agent that you are a health-care worker. Online bookings on the provincial platform require a personal health number.

#### PHSA MASK USE POLICY & SELF-SERVE DISPENSERS

- Self-serve medical face mask dispensers are installed at building entrances in order to comply
  with the provincial mask policy, which states that masks worn in medical facilities including
  hospitals must be medical grade.
- The self-serve mask dispensers are intended for all care providers, staff, vendors and contractors, who should replace their personal mask with a medical mask at a building entrance, or proceed to a different entrance if there are no medical masks available.
- All patients will be offered a medical face mask by entrance screeners; however as previously stated, there may be reasons why someone is unable or declines to wear a mask, including history of abuse and trauma, mental health concerns, physical health conditions, or age.
- All persons entering hospital buildings are requested to don a medical mask by following these procedures:
  - 1. Remove your personal mask if you're wearing one;
  - 2. Sanitize your hands using hand sanitizer; and
  - 3. Remove one medical mask from the dispenser and follow proper procedures to don the mask.
- Please remember that masks are only one part of our infection control strategy. Stay home if you
  have any signs of illness, complete <a href="PHSA's self-screening assessment tool">PHSA's self-screening assessment tool</a> before arriving onsite,
  practice physical distancing and maintain good hand hygiene.

#### Taking time for self-care

- It can be hard to stop and think about self-care even during "normal" times, but we know that applying self-care strategies to daily life can help reduce the negative psychological and physical effects of stress.
